Artistic collaboration is very rare in visual arts. But when it is, impressions are of Photographer Lisa Borgiani and Painter Massimo Nidini.

Lisa documents her travels by building a picture out of whatever pertinent ite to tell the story; and to those detail shots Massimo adds diversity with his porbodied texture.

The oeuvres, then, evidence a persistent return to the relationship of two trace and painting.

"The beauty of the light and all the games I can play with it animates me in p Verona, Italy. "It means to enter in another world with a sublime moment; ar shot.
